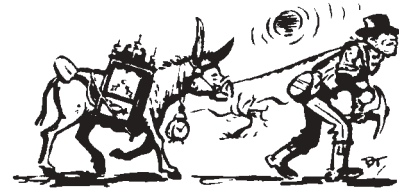

### The Rite of Spring!

Well spring, new-year's day, your birthday whatever day of the year you choose works for winding your 400-day clock.

Our June program features Larry Squires who will give us a comprehensive presentation on these interesting but often misunderstood clocks.

Larry will start with a brief history of the clocks, where they started, which companies were key to the development and how they became prevalent in the mid 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Larry will add to the history with a discussion of the various styles and types of clocks that fall into the category of 400-day clocks and

describe why some of these design changes adopted.

Finally, Larry will "tear down" a typical clock and show the key issues in the repair and restoration of the movement including getting these sometimes fussy clocks "in beat."

Larry's presentation will answer many of your questions about these interesting clocks and may make you see them in a new and different light.

Be sure to attend this informative presentation and bring your questions for Larry. Also, don't forget to bring a 400-day clock for show and tell this month, especially one that may have some unusual features or story associated with it.

## Meeting Minutes *(from page 1)*

Thanks to Larry Squires for providing tonight's refreshments.

Some highlights from tonight's video: – If a pendulum has been altered or is not the original, the weight might have to be changed.

To let down the main spring, use a let down key and put wire around the spring to keep it contained. You can also use a ring to contain the spring. Order a new spring if the old one doesn't expand when let out. Be sure to wear gloves.

Show and Tell – Letter "J".

Doug Adams wanted to bring in the "Junghans" (young'uns) but he wasn't allowed to bring in the kids.

Dave Weisbart brought in a Chauncey Jerome – the company was bought out in 1855 by New Haven. In England the name used was Jerome & Co. This clock has 3 weights, an alarm mechanism and painted glass.



Larry Squires brought in a J. Kaiser, made from 1952-1953 with a "Universe Globe" pendulum. It is a 400-Day clock, and also has a moon phase in which the moon turns. There was a copyright issue over the use of the name "Universe".

Tony Baker brought in a JAPY French movement "pottery clock".



Doug Adams brought a deluxe version of a Jacob toolbox set, with jewellery press and all the bells and whistles, made by SEITZ.

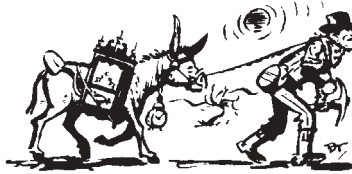
It's time to renew your membership to Chapter 69. Your support of our activities is very important to the chapter's well-being, so we're counting on every member to send in his or her renewal.
